The Project Supporting Guiding and Scouting in Eastern and Central Europe

The aim of the Danish project in 2010/2011.

- To assist in at least 10 leader capacity training and development projects in at least 4 different countries.
- To give the involved Danish trainers a broader perspective through training in Denmark and through participation in international training.

The aim of the project is set by the *Committee to Support International Scouting Needs*. The Committee chairs Her Royal Highness Princess Benedikte, a number of CEO's from Danish Industry and representatives from the Joint Committee of Girl Guides in Denmark (PFP) and the Danish Scout Council (FDD).

The Committee raises funds through dialogue with companies within Danish Industry, which have a special interest in guiding and scouting or/and capacity grow of youth in Eastern and Central Europe.

The funds are handed over from the Committee to the Steering Committee for the Project Supporting Guiding and Scouting in Eastern and Central Europe, which turns it into leader training and development for the benefit of guiding and scouting in our "neighbor" countries but also for the benefit of guiding and scouting in Denmark.

On the last Steering Committee meeting The Project Supporting Guiding and Scouting in Eastern and Central Europe approved projects in the following countries.

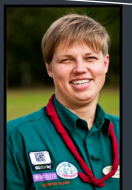

Scout for Climate Camp & Summit

The Project Supporting Guiding and Scouting in Eastern and Central Europe made it possible for scouts and guides from Eastern Europe to participate in the activities going on in Copenhagen during the COP15.

The Scout for Climate Camp at the central square in the middle on Copenhagen in Denmark had more than 10.000 visitors including Her Royal Highness Princess Benedikte, seeing the way scouts and guides can influence the way of life around the globe from an environmental perspective.

The Scout for Climate Summit had participation from scouts and guides from 32 countries making environmental projects, which now are being implemented locally in Macedonia, Moldova, Romania, Slovakia, Tajikistan etc.

Ciprian Sfirlogea from Slovakia project is to "raise awareness of primary school children (aged 7-11 years) about the benefits of recycling paper" and Sergiu Chirica from Moldova project is to "raise awareness about the impact of using plastic waste. The project aims at evaluating the pollution of the Prut River throughout its length. As a means of transport we will use rafts made of plastic bottles that will facilitate the formation of ecological culture of the population".
